"Prior to an event, I help customers decide what works best for their venue and budget. I work closely with them on type, quantity and placement of units. When I visit an event, I determine if the units are appropriate, sufficient, properly sited and positioned in a user-friendly way. That way, I can help the client plan for the next event."

Knowledge and competence are necessary but not enough, believes this dedicated coordinator. "Like everyone at Diamond, I love serving our customers. I make sure people get the kind of unit that I would use."
